

Key Expectations

Dress Code

The school is a workplace and all students and staff must dress appropriately for the working environment. Any clothing that attracts undue attention may be deemed inappropriate.

Students are to dress modestly and within the outlined dress code
Parents/guardians are to enforce the dress code expectations.

Main areas of focus of the dress code:

- no headgear while in the building
- underwear is under cover
- modest attire: no cleavage, no spaghetti straps; more clothing than skin
- shorts and skirts are to be mid-thigh or longer

Should a staff member identify that a student's clothing is not appropriate, the student is to correct it immediately ...

- change into other clothes they have at school
- borrow from a friend
- have someone bring appropriate clothes to school for them
- wear clothing provided by the school

If no appropriate solution can be found, the student will work in an isolated location for the day such as the office.

Academics

- Students are to be diligent in pursuing their course work and academic studies
- Students are to seek extra help as necessary and use flex sessions to improve their course marks
- Parents are to monitor progress via powerschool
- Parents are to work with teachers to support their child's academics, especially attending parent-teacher interviews

Attendance

- Students are to attend school everyday and attend all classes each day.
- Parents/guardians are to inform the school when their child will be late or absent.

- Students are to check in at the office when they arrive late.
- Parents/guardians are to monitor attendance via powerschool.
- Parents/guardians are to work with the school to overcome attendance issues.

School Response To Attendance Concerns

Attendance is monitored weekly by the advisors and by the office.

Parents/guardians will be contacted should the school have concerns about attendance.

- Parents/guardians will be required to meet with school staff should the concern continue
- If the concern can not be corrected between the school and parents, a referral to the attendance board will be made

Technology

- Technology is to be for educational purposes, whether it is school owned technology or personal technology
- Technology which disrupts the learning environment will be confiscated
 - first offence, student may pick up the technology from the office at the end of the day
 - future offences, parent/guardian must come to school to pick up the technology
 - too many offences and the school may forbid the student to bring technology into the building

Staying Informed

- Parents/guardians are encouraged to stay connected to what is happening at the school

- check powerschool regularly
- sign up for the Remind service with each of your child's teachers

- provide the school with an email address so you will receive periodic email messages
- attend the monthly meetings of the School Council/PAC
